Wisdom from the Pews

The San Gabriel Mountains rise in grandeur above the Los Angeles basin. Mt. Baldy to the east and Mount Wilson above Pasadena are well-known peaks for Angelenos. You might be surprised to learn, that by one account, the City of the Angels is where "...the Son of Man (will be seen) coming in the clouds with great power and glory, and (from there) he will send out the angels..."

As an impressionable and imaginative youngster growing up in the 1950s in Covina, this is how I saw the end times happening. Vividly. Yep, Jesus in a massive cloud, with angels at his sides, coming right over Mount Wilson. Trumpets blaring. It was awesome, but very scary. Did the writers have to be so frightening?

The liturgical year always ended with such dreadful scriptures foretelling the end of the world. How would the stars fall? How dark would it be? What tribulations are we talking about?

Putting a child's imagination aside, what are Daniel and Mark talking about? Daniel introduces Michael as some kind of master guardian angel. He also speaks of an awakening (resurrection) of those asleep and a living forever, either in "everlasting horror" or as a "star forever."

Biblical scholars have several views of Mark's description of cosmic turmoil. Perhaps he is talking of the destruction of the temple in 70AD. What could be more disconcerting for a pious Jew? Or maybe he refers to darkness over the land at Jesus' crucifixion—a totally disheartening event for his followers. Or is Mark foretelling the



end of time? At that time, the Parousia (the second coming) was generally believed to be imminent.

Whatever the reason for cosmic turmoil, Mark is saying be watchful, be ready, be prepared. How should we make sense of the times and these passages today? Why should the faithful not be afraid? How can we take Mark's admonition - be prepared for whatever - in a positive way and not be distressed?

ing us to be fearful, but rather joyful, active, and full of awe.

I offer two suggestions. One way is to be in awe of the creative beauty and energy of God. We can enjoy the fresh sprouting leaves of a fig (or peach) tree, or a budding rose, or an emerging crocus. We can ponder the words of Jesuit poet Gerald Manley Hopkins, "The world is charged with the grandeur of God...It gathers to a greatness..."

At Gonzaga University, in a stairwell, there hung a painting, by William Andrew Vachon, SJ, of the Cosmic Creator's finger, coming out of a billowing cloud, holding a solitary figure. Again, depicting the awesomeness of God's power. This is a joyful God; not One causing distress.

A second suggestion is to live each day to its fullest. Just today God, just today.

Mark says only God knows "when". Daniel promises "the wise shall shine brightly" and if one leads a faithful life, one "shall be like the stars forever." Today, be wise, shine brightly, act justly. Today, be the hands and heart Christ. Today, love your neighbor. If today, we do live thusly, there will be no time to be afraid. God is not call-

I don't know the particulars of a second coming, but if Jesus were to come again, over Mount Wilson, in a cloud of angels, wouldn't you want a front row seat?
