Wisdom from the Pews



These epic one-liners in the Gospel tend to get all the attention. I mean, c'mon, the "eye of a needle" line is timeless. But when preparing for this reflection, I couldn't stop thinking about this one detail hidden in that one-liner's shadow: Jesus *loved* the young man.

And because Christ's camel remark seemed to scold the young man, this detail presented a puzzling question: why was it even included in the Gospel? I think that can be answered by (1) looking at the young man's question, (2) using today's other readings as a backdrop, and (3) putting ourselves in the young man's shoes. Then, perhaps, we can walk away from today's gospel with a deeper, more personal message than just the camel analogy.

There is another answer—the very same answer—to the young man's question. To inherit eternal life, one must "love the Lord, your God, with all your heart, with all your being, with all your strength, and with all your mind, and your neighbor as yourself." (Lk 10:27). That's a straightforward message. But in today's gospel, the young man did not receive that message verbatim. Instead, the young man received a personalized answer in addition to an explicit mention of Jesus's love.

Today's other readings help clarify why the young man received a personalized answer from Jesus. We hear that the word of God is "sharper than any two-edged sword," "able to discern" our hearts, leaving us "naked and exposed" before Him. As the young man knelt before Jesus, I think Jesus looked at the man and saw *everything* in his heart. And Jesus must have seen something He loved, because He gifted the young man wisdom that "deemed riches nothing" in comparison. For this wisdom was



the word of God, it cut the young man so deep that his face dropped, and he turned away sad. Talk about a walk of shame.

Now let's put ourselves in the young man's shoes. Here was someone who seemingly had it all: money, power, youth, and righteousness. In other words, the young man had wealth. And who among us has similar wealth: good health, financial well-being, family, friends, status, youth, righteousness, and the list goes on. We have all these things that we love. Even so, if we are to inherit eternal life, we must love God with *all* our heart, *all* our being, *all* our strength, and *all* our mind—not to mention loving our neighbor as ourselves. Admittedly, that can sound like a tall order. And if Jesus told each of us that to inherit eternal life, we would have to give up our wealth—children, parents, siblings, spouses, pets, and property—then follow Him, wouldn't *you* turn away sad? I know I would.



Now I know why this hidden detail was included in today's gospel. Jesus knows that you and I are no different from the young man in today's gospel. And just as Jesus *loved* the young man, so too does He *love* you.



The family stays at Tibbetts House for a few weeks before moving out to their permanent housing. Besides providing the family with the most basic needs, such a food and warm clothes, the regular visits and presence of volunteers make it easier for the refugees to deal with the anxiety of the first few weeks of their new life in America.

Our parishioners recently helped a family of 5 from Somalia, they just moved to their apartment last week. Our parish is getting ready to host a family of 11, with 9 small children ranging from infant to 17 years old, arriving in two weeks.
