

A Message from the Pastor

For the next five weeks you will gradually see five banners appear in our sanctuary. These



In the first banner, St. Ignatius is shown as the worldly knight who is wounded at the battle of Pamplona. His armored helmet and gloves have fallen away from the battle and toward the first glimmering of God's call to him. After a cannon ball broke his leg, Ignatius had to be carried by others. How often have failures or disasters in our life led to our being carried by our family and friends? Because Ignatius fought so bravely against overwhelming forces, the French had him taken to his ancestral home at Loyola. During an extended period of convalescence there, Ignatius gradually turned his mind and heart from pre-occupation with self-glory to a passion for the greater glory of God.

Ignatius' conversion began with a great catastrophe. It began with a failure. But God's grace, as St. Paul reminds us, works best in our weakness.

Jesuit poet Gerard Manley Hopkins, in the first lines of his *The Wreck of the Deutschland*, could have been describing Ignatius' experience at Pamplona when he wrote:

Thou mastering me God! giver of breath and bread; World's strand, sway of the sea; Lord of the living and dead; Thou hast bound bones and veins in me, fastened me flesh, And after it almost unmade, what with dread, Thy doing: and dost thou me afresh? Over again I feel thy finger and find thee.

Pastor's Message continued from page one:

I have convalesced from two knee replacement surgeries. Besides lots of physical therapy, I had lots of time on my hands to both read and reflect. Ignatius only had two books available during his recovery— Ludolph of Saxony's Life of Christ and The Golden Legend which was a book on the lives of the saints. Just imagine months and months of recovery with no iPhone, no iPad, no iPod nano, no radio or television in HD.

Ronald Rolheiser, one of my favorite contemporary spiritual writers, describes providence as "a conspiracy of accidents." That a military failure led to Ignatius serving a different king—providential. That the only two books at Loyola castle were a life of Christ and the lives of the saints—providential. That God's ways are not our ways—providential. That God doesn't think the way we think—providential. That God often undoes us to touch us afresh-providential.

The next time your expectations are frustrated, or the precious work of your hands fails, instead of wasting time on the "pity pot," why not entertain the life-changing question—"How is God's grace and love at work in this?" In doing so, you are entering



the arena of grace that Ignatius of Loyola gradually entered after a providential defeat at Pamplona.
