Wisdom from the Pews

Advent is the time of year when God sends us to the desert for a while to prepare for Christmas. Today's scripture is a reminder that He will always call us back to "take off the garment of [our] sorrow and affliction ... and put on the beauty of the glory from God."

We often learn life's most important lessons in the desert. I grew up in the Portland area, but after I graduated from college, God called me to the desert in Albuquerque, New Mexico. He called me to a place far away from my friends and family to strengthen my faith and to teach me lessons that I desperately needed to learn.

When I entered the desert, I measured my worth based on how other people saw me instead of on how God saw me. I allowed others to use me how they saw fit, instead of following the desires that the Lord placed in my heart. I was afraid to use my voice. My time in the desert pushed me to a breaking point, and God was there to put me back together. He taught me to use my voice with confidence, and he reassured me of my identity as His beloved child.



He led me to a church community that would love me and care for me. He showed me how to use the gifts He had given me to shine a light in this world. Through these experiences, I learned to lean on God in a way that I never had before. I was no longer the same person who entered the desert because God had transformed me.

After four years in Albuquerque, the Lord called me back to my hometown to build a new life close to my family. My life has changed in many ways since that time, and sometimes the old fears creep back into my heart during times of stress and uncertainty. But now I know how to face those fears, by relying on God's unfailing love and support to carry me through. Continued >>>


