#### A Message from the Pastor

This weekend's gospel features two para-

bles about seeds being sowed and growing. It also happens to be Father's Day. Fathers must wear many hats—maybe not as many as mothers do—but their job description involves multiple tasks and roles. This week's parables remind me about the role of nurturer. While that isn't always at the top of their job description, it is an increasingly important part of being a good father.

During the second week of my time visiting the Pauline sites in Greece, I was on a boat with nine other people. One of those other nine people was my younger sister Kathy Crowley. Over a delightful evening meal, Kathy and I regaled the other pirates with stories about growing up in the Moynahan family. Many of those stories featured my mother (Helen O'Shaughnessy Moynahan) and my two deceased brothers (Tim and Dave).

After delighting the assembled pirates with our stories from growing up, one of the pirates said, "You don't have many stories that involve your father. Do you have any good stories about him?" My sister Kathy and I were silent. The absence of stories about my father probably reflected his absence from our lives growing up. You see, while my mother and father divorced when I was thirteen and my younger sister was eight, my father had been more absent than present for most of our childhood.

Don't get me wrong. We loved our father. He was a big man, larger than




life. He attracted Damon Runyon-esque characters around him—Lido Paduzzi and John Murphy, to name a few. He was the best storyteller I have ever heard or known. He was one for special or grand occasions. If he was a baseball batter, he would have had a lot of homeruns—but twice as many strike outs. Perhaps he was the Dave Kingman of fathers.

The lack of a strong relationship with my father continued to be a source of sadness for me until the age of forty when I read a book entitled *Healing the Un-affirmed*. In the book, the author explained how people cannot give what they have never received. My father had never been significantly affirmed by his father. How could he pass on what he had never received? It helped me understand why my father had such a challenging time being affirming or taking a regular interest in his children.

I'm reading a book these days about another father. His name was Sargent Shriver and it is written by his son Mark Shriver. It is simply entitled *A Good Man*. Sargent Shriver was an irrepressibly positive person full of joy. He used to write encouraging notes to his children daily and slip them under their bedroom doors.



The job of parenting, of being an affirming and nurturing father, is a daunting one. The parables remind us that waking or sleeping the seed continues to grow and bear a harvest. That is God's grace at work in our lives. Fathers, you can depend on it. Sons and daughters, know that our fathers do the best they can. Whatever they can't do, God's grace will find a way to provide. And so we pray for all who serve as fathers and nurturers in our lives.

Thank you for all the fathers and father-figures in this world and for the many ways you use them to lovingly guide others to your heart. We ask that you would bless them and give them great joy and peace. May they see You and know You in new ways. Show them how much you love them and care about them. 
### Listening Devices
