

Wisdom from the Pews

Today's Gospel tells of Jesus and his exhausted disciples, going off in a boat by themselves, seeking rest and solitude, only to find crowds in need of them at their supposed place of retreat. The Old Testament reading suggests that simply doing the work of shepherding is not good enough: it must also be done well. "Woe to the shepherds who mislead and scatter the flock of my pasture." As a church worker, my first response to these readings is one of feeling pressure, expectation, and an inevitably disappointing outcome. How can I possibly serve people well when feeling overwhelmed and depleted?

But my question is: what happened on that boat ride?

The epistle reading invites a different way of discernment. "He is our peace...through him we both have access in one Spirit to the Father." Jesus calls me to be both shepherd and sheep, but—and hallelujah!—I am not alone in this endeavor. In my shepherd role, I remember the first of Jesus' new commands: to love God with my whole self. This is done, in part, by recognizing my lifelong, ongoing experience of holy presence. When I ask the RCIA candidates to share about their experiences of God, each of their stories is unique: recollections of visions, moments of epiphany, comforting light, awe of nature, and providential care. Loving God with my whole heart invites me toward a 'lived experience' of God, grounding me in those moments of encounter, encouraging me to shepherd because he first shepherded me. Or rather: to love, because he first loved us.

I'm getting a sense of what may have happened on that boat ride.

As part of the flock, I recall Jesus' other command, to love my neighbor as myself. This coming fall, in our IGNITE program, we will dive into Cynthia Bourgeault's *The Wisdom Jesus*, a book which helps clarify that loving our neighbor as ourselves does not equate to loving our neighbor as much as we love ourselves. Rather, she suggests that we are called to love our neighbor as an extension of ourselves. When I am truly part of the flock, I am nurtured not only by my own experience of God, but also by the unique presence of God in each member of the flock. When living into these two commands, the peace and respite I experience in myself naturally extends to nurturing and caring for others. Come away to a deserted place all by yourselves and rest a while.

Mark 6:31

These are some of the things that happen on the Faith Formation boat ride, here at St. Ignatius. In a society tending towards individualism, practices such as boundaries, self-care, and independence have become tokens of happiness and fulfillment. Today's readings remind me that boundaries do not supersede connectivity, that care of self naturally extends toward care of one another, and that independence is birthed from our mutual rootedness. Jesus and his disciples go off in a boat by themselves to rest and retreat. And yet, when they arrive to find a crowd in need, Jesus' "heart was moved with pity for them."

And now, I think I know what happened on that boat ride.


