Wisdom from the Pews

Acts of profound faith often look remarkably like foolishness. The widow in this week's Gospel,

who places her last, precious coins into the treasury, defies the rules of common sense by freely giving away all that she has. According to the wisdom of the world, giving everything we have until we are left with nothing—or even less than nothing—is an absurdly reckless thing to do.

And yet I have found, since my husband Matthew and I first became parents, that this is exactly what motherhood demands of me: everything. While parenthood does not exhaust all my financial resources (though doubtless it claims plenty of those, too), it requires of me a continual commitment to self-emptying. All my love, patience, attention, time, and energy are ceaselessly poured out for the sake of my three little ones, even when I feel, as I often do, that I have nothing left to give. Mothers, like the poor widow, give out of their poverty; there is nothing to spare, no surplus in motherhood. Every good gift to our children comes at a real and significant personal cost. I have never liked the term "self-care," which is so often proffered to mothers as the magical antidote to their interminable generosity. Self-care is too small, too thin a concept to stack up against the constant self-sacrifice that is demanded of a mother. Yes, a massage or a nap is always welcomed and appreciated (hint, hint, Matthew) but such niceties can in no way restore a mother from the deficit at which she continually operates, and it is insulting to pretend that they can.

So how, then, do mothers find within themselves the capacity to give out of their emptiness, to care for their children not from a place of excess, but of *poverty*? The poor widow has wisdom to offer here. I don't think she was under any illusion that



God would "reward" her devotion by blessing her with the material wealth she lacked. Her leap of faith at the treasury was not transactional. What she trusted God to do was to fill the privation in her life with *Himself*; the widow believed that she would be sustained in her poverty by God's *love*, not by money.

It is this miracle, I think, which emboldens mothers to radically give away everything that they have. Our willingness to empty ourselves of all our own powers creates space for God to fill us with the strength of *His* love, and this is the mysterious inner fount that never runs dry. The paradox we discover in Christ is that somehow, impossibly, embracing our inner poverty opens the door to abundance.

Now, go find a mother in your life and give her a foot rub. She's earned it.

preschool students, and putting up our family group collages around the


school. Service learning develops our students commitment to building a just and compassionate world for all.
