Wisdom from the Pews

How would you like to start this new liturgical year—with hope or fear? Which do you feel? It's the first Sunday of Advent, and today's readings offer us both. Oddly, perhaps, the hopeful note comes from the usually gloomy prophet Jeremiah, and the looming notes of fear are found on the lips of Jesus in the good news Gospel of Luke.

Jeremiah assures ancient Israel, in the face of their rapacious Babylonian invaders, that an heir to David's throne will rise up and bring sure and certain justice, guaranteeing their safety from all their foes! Jesus, whom we, his followers, believe is that heir, warns of tumult and horror gripping the nations of the world.

Many biblical scholars suggest that the advent of the Messiah was to bring both hope and fear. Hope for downtrodden Israel, fear to Israel's oppressors. Traditionally our celebration of Advent reminds us both of the hope that Jesus' birth brings to the world and the fear that arises from a belief that his

second coming will be one of judgment of a sinful world—something often called "the end of the world!"

This particular Advent launches something a little different, however. This Advent begins a year devoted to Luke's Gospel, who has something nuanced to say about how Jesus' coming into the world brings hope and how we are to await his return.

When John the Baptist appeared in the wilderness to prepare the way for Jesus' mission, he warned of a fearful time to come: "Even now the ax is lying at the root of the trees; every tree therefore that does not bear good fruit is cut down and thrown into the fire." (Luke 3:8-9)


Israel, God's vineyard, was being warned of a frightful judgment awaiting it. There is a parable unique to Luke, however, in which Jesus suggests his mission was about forestalling Israel's race toward destruction. In Luke's telling of the parable of the vineyard that produced no fruit for its owner, instead of simply warning of the vineyard's imminent destruction as we find in Matthew (21:33-41), Luke says the son of the owner begs for three more years to fertilize and tend the vineyard, so that it might actually please the owner. Jesus saw his mission to Israel as bringing hope.



Luke is also unique among the gospels in naming as Jesus' disciples anyone who believes in him. Everyone who proclaims him king at his entry into Jerusalem on a donkey Luke calls his disciples (Luke 19:37-38). Only in Luke do we read of seventy-two disciples, rather than just the twelve, sent out on mission (Luke 10:1). Scholars suggest Luke is referring to all of us and our mission. In the face of all the world's fears, which so many in the world most certainly face, we are called upon to spread the good news that peace can happen—it is not too late—because we, as followers of Jesus, are bearers of forgiveness, of healing, of reconciliation.
