

Wisdom from the Pews

My father left Vietnam, along with the U.S. military, on April 26, 1975, four days before the war ended. Two days later, my mother's employer told her they would evacuate Vietnamese employees and their immediate family who were willing to leave. We were given 24 hours to pack. My mother, two sisters, and I left our homeland with literally two changes of clothing. Nothing more. No teddy bears, toys, photos, or unnecessary things. What my mother, a woman of tremendous faith, packed in abundance was trust in God's providence, for we did not know if we would be reunited with my father, nor what awaited us in America.

When I entered the Jesuit novitiate in 2011, I did so with three suitcases of belongings. Let's just say that if I had to move now to a new mission, I would definitely need more than three suitcases. I won't tell you how many. Jesus instructs the apostles in this weekend's Gospel to "to take nothing for the journey but a walking stick— no food, no sack, no money in their belts." They can wear sandals but not a second tunic. Clearly Jesus was a light traveler and wants the disciples to be the same. I, on the other hand, am a traveler who tends to overpack. You know, just in case. Just in case the weather changes. Just in case there is no laundry facility. Just in case the airline loses my luggage.

Today's Gospel marks a new stage in the formation of the apostles. They have been given authority over unclean spirits. They preach repentance – that radical conversion (Greek, *metanoia*) to the vision of the Kingdom. They anoint



the sick with oil and heal them. They have everything they need to do exactly the same work that Jesus has been doing. All their other needs would be taken care of by others. So the Lord instructs them to travel lightly.

They are to show total dependence on and trust in God. This is freedom at its best. This is the spiritual freedom my mother embodied when she chose to flee our homeland with three young children so that we could enjoy the freedom this great country provides.

Today, we cannot quite follow Jesus' instructions literally, although the ideal is certainly applicable. Do we really need all the baggage we carry through life? Do we depend on the material comforts of modern life more than we depend on God? We can go through our lives laden with things, with

property and possessions that are an endless source

of worry and anxiety. We become their slaves. There are other worries and anxieties in our heads which can paralyze us and prevent us from living rich and fulfilling lives. It would be worth reflecting today on how free our lives are and where real wealth is to be found. As someone has said, "Those are really rich whose needs are the least". That is what Jesus is teaching us. And, of course, he was a living example. This is what we too are all called to do within the circumstances of our life — having little, but giving much.


