Wisdom from the Pews

At St. Ignatius, we have a life-sized ver-

sion of the Nativity scene. The one that my family puts up annually under the tree is much smaller. In France, during the latter part of the 13th century, their Nativity scenes included other figures called "little saints" (santons). A family's crèche display might include such "little saints" as the local baker, the farmer, the seamstress, the priest, the banker, and all the villagers.

When I studied philosophy in Chicago, as soon as my final papers were turned in, I would rush downtown to visit the Art Institute of Chicago Museum. There, every year during the holiday season, the museum displays its 18th century Neapolitan version of the French crèche with "little saints." See the photo I took in 2013. The upper register of the crèche contains the main characters of the Nativity—the Holy Family (Mary, Joseph, and Jesus) and the Three Wise Men, along with angels and shepherds. Surrounding them are scenes of Neapolitan daily life, including a raucous tavern, a bucolic pasture, and a street crowded with vendors. These are the santons from all walks of life who make life possible for the citizens of Naples.

St. Ignatius of Loyola, in the Spiritual Exercises, invites us to imagine ourselves in the biblical scene. This Christmas, as you look at our Christmas crèche in the church or your crèche at home, imagine yourself as part of this scene. But also imagine who else would be present for the birth of Emmanuel (God-with-



Us). I imagine my deceased relatives—my grandparents, my godfather, and others who have passed on. I imagine Jesuits, living and dead, who have incarnated God's love for me.

I imagine the amazing parish staff I am blessed to have as companions in mission. I imagine the volunteers who generously devote their gifts and talents to serve in the various ministries at our parish. I imagine the newest members of our parish. I imagine the families we've hosted at Tibbetts House. I imagine family and friends at a distance, especially those who reveal to me the presence and love of God made flesh through their friendship. And, I imagine all of you. Who do you imagine to be with you around the crèche?

St. Francis of Assisi was on to something back in 1223, when he instituted the reality of a manger scene. The French were on to something in inviting people to put "little saints" along with the biblical characters in the Nativity scene. St. Ignatius was on to something when he invited us to imagine ourselves in this biblical scene. What they were on to was the mystery of God encountered in human flesh and blood. So let Carolyn Winfrey Gillette's words remind us:

In this time of celebration, may we show what life can be, as we care for God's creation, as we serve the Prince of Peace. Seeking justice everywhere, lifting burdens others bear, may we gladly serve and pray—knowing why we live this way: in one little baby's birth, God knelt down to love the earth.



We welcomed many grandparents and special friends to see the final rehearsal of our Christmas Program this past Thursday morning. The students' artwork adorned the evening's programs creating a special memento. Mr. Mackenzie and the students knocked it out of the park again this year with yet another fabulous Christmas Program! The student renditions of *"The Advent Song" and "Let*



There Be Peace on Earth" were particularly touching. What a joy to celebrate the Advent season together!

Our students have fully embraced the season of Advent while serving, learning, and growing.

Our preschool and 6th grade classes partner together periodically to up date the church pews with fresh envelopes in service for our community.



The preschoolers created their own paper Christmas trees building their fine motor skills. The kindergarten students recreate the nativity adding their own creations right through Epiphany. Our first graders have been practicing their addition skills through Christmas tree addition. The second graders explored states of matter in science through a hands-on insulation lab along with

creating data graphs. The third graders learned to sew making felt stockings. Our fourth graders are studying chain reactions and studying the regions of Oregon. The fifth graders have been studying freshwater in the world experimenting with various types of simulated aquifers. The sixth graders wrote "Merry Christmas" greetings in the language of their home heritage and visited the elderly at Courtyard Mt. Tabor. The seventh graders wrote poems about Christmas and assembled the weekly sack lunches for Transition Projects to distribute to those in need in our local community. Lastly, the eighth graders recently enjoyed a field trip to the Portland Center Stage to see a production of Shakesphere's *12th Night*. Actors from Portland Center Stage



visited the class before their field trip to lead them through a workshop about the play. Our students truly enjoy engaging their eager minds, passionate hearts, and enthusiastic spirits!

Our *school auction* will take place on **Saturday, March 1, 2025** during *Mardi Gras* season. Our school auction will be called *Aspire, Believe, Celebrate.* Our theme reflects our school's mission in that we *Aspire* to develop students committed to building a just and compassionate world for all. *Believe* in our students' gifts and talents. *Celebrate* our students' accomplishments along the way.
