
Pastoral Council

Wisdom from the Pews

The readings for this week are all about loving God. What does it mean to love the Lord our God?



Thirty years later, I can see that the acts of love have sustained our marriage even when the feelings of love have been sometimes hard to find, like the times when busyness at work created distance at home, or when we were struggling financially, or when we were caring for my difficult father-in-law at the end of his life. We chose love by choosing to work together to overcome these challenges, rather than accepting the chill that was creeping into our daily interactions.

My conversion twelve years ago began with such a simple act: the choice to spend quiet time in the morning exploring the new stirrings in my heart that were leading me towards God.

Sometimes, I used scripture and sometimes other faith-based books. I didn't always choose that material wisely. But the consistency of choosing to show up day after day began to build a relationship between God and me that carries me to this day.

But the choice to love came first, then the feeling. Love is not rational. I couldn't think my way into this new relationship. There was no scientific evidence available to demonstrate that my new-found beliefs were true. There was just an invitation, and a response.



Eventually, that became showing up for Mass every Sunday, and choosing to say the Creed as if I believed it. And then choosing to believe it, despite the absence of proof, because the words had cracked open my heart. And then choosing to formally

embrace it through the Sacraments of Baptism and Confirmation, gifts I freely chose to accept. And then continuing to show up, day after day, week after week, whether I felt like it or not, even after the newness had worn off.

Those words I found in M. Scott Peck were also core to the spirituality of St. Ignatius who wrote, "Love is shown more in deeds than in words" and whose Spiritual Exercises are themselves an invitation to choose a deep, loving relationship with our Lord.

There are definitely days when God feels closer, or God feels more absent. Some days, all I have to give doesn't feel like very much. But I can always choose to love God, and rest in the belief that God is with me, whether I feel it or not.

For the fiscal year ending September 30th, your twenty-one SVdP volunteers helped to deliver 19,100 lbs of food to 307 families in our neighborhood. Additionally, \$10,232 in rent and utility assistance was provided to 28 persons in need. A total of 821 individuals were served. Thanks to our volunteers for their dedicated efforts and to the parishioners who made donations of food and cash to make this possible.

Requests from our neighborhood are then forwarded to our SVdP pantry that delivers food to those in need on Saturday mornings.
