A Message from the Pastor


This is my next to last *Message from the*Pastor. In this Message, I don't want to focus on this weekend's scripture readings.

Instead, I would like to focus on our pastoral staff.

In Sacramento, we had a pastoral staff three times the size of our staff here in Portland. That pretty much means that fewer people are asked to do more here in the Rose City. And they do it willingly, generously, and gratefully. I would like to personally thank Fr. Craig Boly for putting together the nucleus of this amazing pastoral staff that I inherited. They are not only talented and committed, they actually enjoy working together and all the people we serve. Together, we are able to care for the people and their needs which are entrusted to us.

Patty Frangipani is the first person you meet when you walk through the front door entrance of our parish office. She welcomes everyone. She does her best to respond to their needs. She looks for the good in everyone before her and almost always finds that good, calls it out, and strengthens it for when they leave.

Grace and Joseph Byrd are incredible. Those of you who attend Sunday morning Masses have experienced the gift of their music at our worship. What many of you don't see are all of their pastoral gifts (which they share daily) that don't involve music. Grace and her helpers run the RCIA and all the sacramental preparation programs. She also is the Business Manager for both the parish and the School. Joseph is really our pastoral administrator. He adds the "nitty" to the "gritty" of all our pastoral services and events.



I think that God must really like St. Ignatius Parish. During the month of July, Fr. David Krol, S.J., a French Jesuit, will be helping with sacramental ministry at our parish until our new associate pastor arrives. I'm a French Jesuit who was ordained to the priesthood on January 6, 2024, in the charming city of Marseille.

Reflecting on my journey, I swapped test tubes and Bunsen burners for the Bible and became a Jesuit. Before taking this leap of faith, I studied chemistry and physics, working as a laboratory technician for six years. I grew up in the picturesque Puy-de-Dôme, a region known for its volcanoes, cheeses, and being the birthplace of Michelin tires. But in 2008, inspired by a friend's faith and the writings of Saint Paul, I had a profound conversion, diving headfirst into Ignatian spirituality and service to the poor. I joined the Jesuit novitiate in 2013 and am currently working on a Sacred Theology License in Spirituality at the Jesuit School of Theology in Berkeley. I can't wait to meet you at St. Ignatius Church, where you'll be charmed by my French accent in my homilies.


Listening Devices
