Wisdom from the Pews

You may notice the title for this section of our parish bulletin has been renamed from "Message from the Pastor" to "Wisdom from the Pews." If you're thinking that there has been an editorial change, you are correct. I am opening up these reflections to all of you, and I invite you to consider writing a reflection on our Sunday readings at Mass from time to time. Why am I doing this?

First, the responsibility of preaching the Good News is not just mine as a priest. By virtue of our baptism, all of us are called to preach the Good News. Since most of you are not able to preach at Mass, I want to offer this space to enable you to share your faith, to share the gift of your wisdom to the entire parish community. Some of you may think to yourself, "I don't have any wisdom to share." I've talked to many of you to know that there is a marvelous deposit of wisdom in our community. Wisdom is a gift of the Holy Spirit and we are all recipients of this grace — "For the LORD gives wisdom, from his mouth come knowledge and understanding." (Prov 2:6)

Second, each of us has a sacred story to tell. The Jesuit mission is grounded in the seeking of God in all things. We believe the face of Christ is there in each member of our parish family. The Spirit is woven into our stories, and our stories — good and bad, ugly and resplendent — are the stepping-stones of God's creation...God's creation which reveals God's own story.



As I've said before in a prior homily, we come to Mass every weekend but we don't really know one another, do we? In many ways, we are strangers even though we recognize one another's faces at the grocery store. Yet each stranger we meet at St. Ignatius is a person with real stories, many which we can never fully know. I realize the brevity of these "Wisdom from the Pews" reflections can limit how much of our story we can share.

Nevertheless, there is plenty of space for you to share something of your faith, your journey, or your story as they connect to the Scripture readings for Mass. As I've learned from my own preaching, you will be surprised at how your sharing may inspire, touch, or connect with another parishioner you may not know. The Holy Spirit abides.

Finally, sharing our sacred stories is another way for us to be a listening church. I believe there is something holy, something sacred, to pause and

> reverence the stories that some will share with great vulnerability and tenderness. My hope is that it will enable us to get to know one another a bit better. Strangers still, but less so. We remain confident that

one day we "shall know fully, as [we are] fully known." (1 Cor 13:12) Until then, we keep weaving our stories, wandering and wondering.


